3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Emergency Overview

Harmful in contact with skin and if swallowed or splashed into the eyes. Causes burns.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Moderately irritating to eyes.

Skin: Moderately irritating to skin. No more than slightly toxic if absorbed.

Ingestion: No more than slightly toxic if swallowed. Significant adverse health effects

are not expected to develop if only small amounts (less than a mouthful) are swallowed.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES
